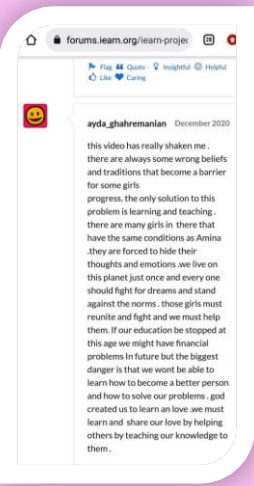

The group we started working with is from Tanzania, and a part of their project is related to girls' education in Tanzania.

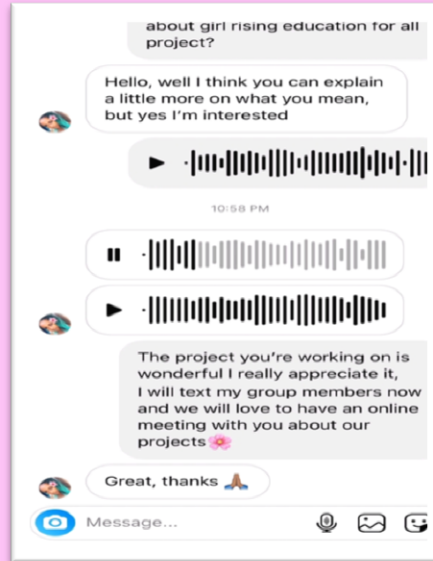
We are so happy that our projects are similar and we can work together a lot more! We are so thankful that dear Jacqueline Mgane has shared her group's beneficial outcomes with us.

Why Girls' Education Matters?

Investing in girls' education provides a boost to a developing country's progress

It results in healthier and better-educated children.

Better-educate mothers have healthier and better-educated children who are more likely to benefit from adequate nutrition and immunizations, attend school more regularly and longer, and study more frequently.

It increases women's political leadership.

From community councils to national offices, girls' education helps give women the skills they need to play leadership roles in public life. Better-educated women are more likely to participate in volunteer and elected decision-making bodies at all levels. In these roles, some country studies suggest, they are much more likely to serve as advocates for decisions and policies that benefit family and community life, such as improved social services.

It reduces rates of child marriage.

Girls who are better educated are less likely to be married off as children and are more likely to have opportunities to build a healthier and more prosperous life for themselves and their families.

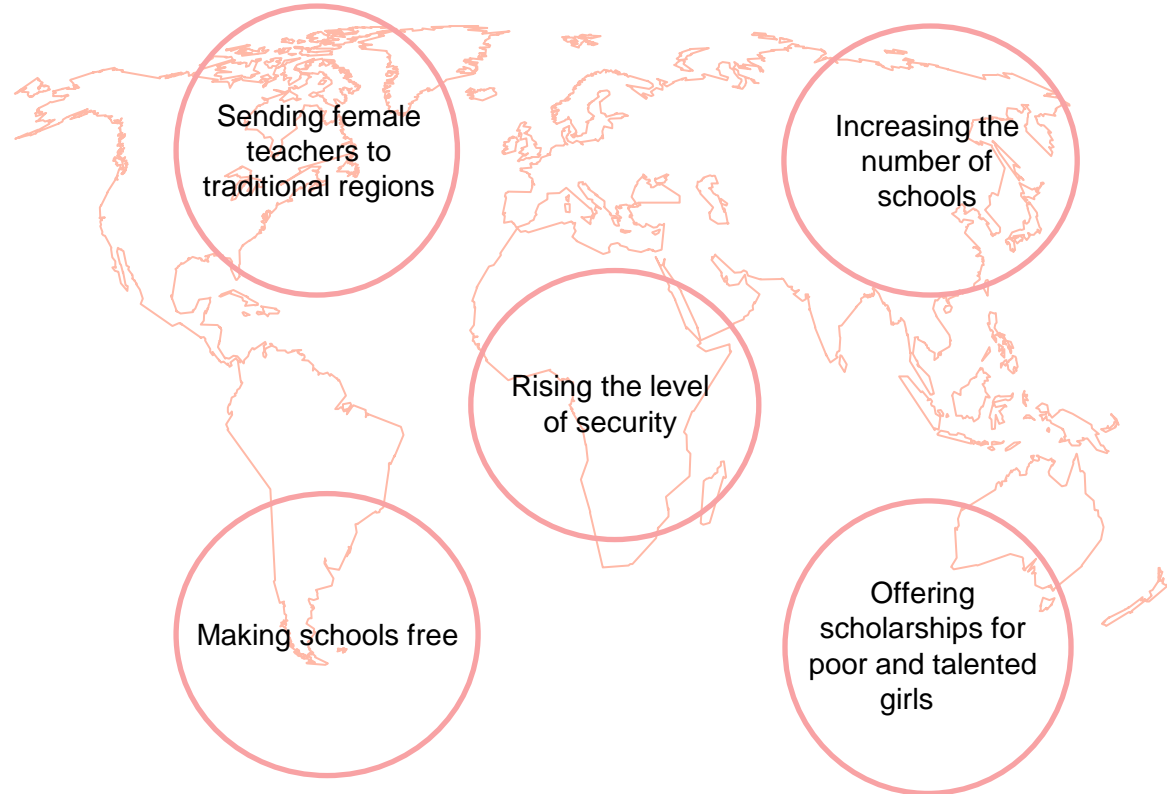
What can we do?

Informing people about the importance of education and the destructive consequences which could be caused in lack of it

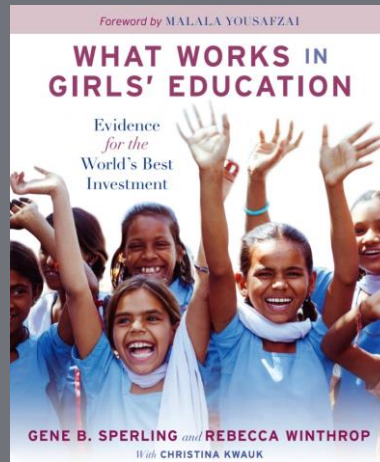

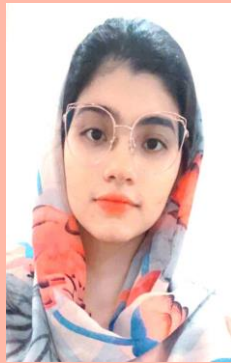
